

H1N1 Vaccine Reporting of Administration/Wastage

Dear H1N1 Influenza Vaccine Provider,

This email contains current information on your H1N1 vaccine order summary, including doses shipped, redistributed, administered, and wasted (please see below). Per the 2009 Novel Influenza A H1N1 Monovalent Vaccine Provider Agreement, recipients of the H1N1 vaccine agreed to:

- Report the number of doses of 2009 H1N1 Influenza vaccine administered to individuals
- Report the number of doses of vaccine that were not able to be used because the vaccine expiration date was exceeded or the vaccine was wasted for other reasons.

H1N1 Vaccine Administration/Wastage Accounting:

If you have not already done so, please take a moment to access the link below and report H1N1 vaccine doses administered and/or wasted to the appropriate system. H1N1 Vaccine Inventory Survey and Disposal Information:

It is important that you also complete a **4 question survey** about your H1N1 vaccine inventory by calling the Interactive Voice Response system at 1-888-H1N1- VAC (1-888-416-1822). The NYSDOH is planning to collect unused vaccine and pay the costs of disposal. We need to know how much useable H1N1 vaccine you currently have in total, how much of your total useable H1N1 vaccine is manufactured by Sanofi Pasteur, how much of this useable Sanofi Pasteur H1N1 vaccine you would like to keep for future use, and of **all** the H1N1 vaccine you received, how many doses were wasted (including expired and recalled vaccine that was **not** administered). Please Note: several Sanofi Pasteur vaccine lots do not expire until **3/2011-6/2011**. We are encouraging all providers who still have vaccine in these lots to consider keeping it in order to:

- Vaccinate children who are less than 10 and need a second H1N1 dose
- Vaccinate children under 10, who have not yet received any H1N1 vaccine, but if vaccinated now will likely need only 1 seasonal influenza vaccine dose containing H1N1 antigen in the fall.
- Vaccinate individuals in the early fall, in the event that there is a delay in production of the 2010-2011 trivalent seasonal influenza vaccine.

Once you have reported H1N1 doses that have been administered and/or wasted at your facility and completed the 4 survey questions, you will be placed on a list to receive H1N1 vaccine disposal information from NYSDOH. Proper vaccine disposal, especially those vaccines containing Thimerosal, can be a costly process. When you have completed the survey, you will be sent instructions on disposing of unused H1N1 vaccine at no cost to you.
