Dear Colleagues,

Disease surveillance data suggest a tough winter ahead. We have recently reported pediatric deaths from influenza and COVID-19, including in otherwise healthy children who were unvaccinated. In addition, there are high rates of hospitalization for other respiratory viruses.

The good news is that for both influenza and COVID-19 there is a vaccine approved for children 6 months and older, including COVID <u>bivalent boosters</u>. But far too few families are opting to vaccinate their children. I again ask for your help in ensuring that all eligible children presenting for care are offered vaccination against both influenza and COVID-19. These vaccines will help reduce morbidity and mortality – and help protect others who cannot be vaccinated.

Co-administration of COVID-19 and influenza vaccines is well-tolerated by children. Please encourage your patients to get both. And remember, for initial vaccination the immunity benefit will take a week or two. Now is the right time to get children vaccinated for the holidays. The new (smaller) minimum order <u>sizes</u> and the single dose vials are now available and make it easier for smaller practices to keep vaccines on hand.

I deeply appreciate your hard work in providing care for our youngest New Yorkers. What you do makes an important difference in children's lives and in their families' lives.
