## • SPHP GOES RED FOR WOMEN'S HEALTH

Starting Feb. 1, St. Peter's and Samaritan hospitals — including the Albany Memorial and St. Mary's campuses— was be among the dozens of Capital Region buildings illuminated in red, in support of American Heart Month. Taking place on the eve of the "National Wear Red Day," this effort aims to shine a light on women's heart health. According to the American Heart Association (AHA), heart disease and stroke cause 1 in 3 deaths among women each year, killing approximately one woman every 80 seconds. Despite these risks, however, many women don't realize that it's their no. 1 health threat and that 80 percent of cardiac and stroke events may be prevented with education and action. The AHA started its "Go Red for Women" campaign 20 years ago to support educational programs to increase women's awareness and critical research to discover scientific knowledge about cardiovascular health.

• \$3.9 MILLION GRANT AWARDED TO AMC

Scientists at Albany Medical College have been awarded a five-year, \$3.9 million grant from the National Institutes of Health (NIH) to study biomarkers present in the blood of patients who have had Covid-19 but continue to experience symptoms for weeks or months after the initial infection."Ultimately, our goal is to develop a blood test that pinpoints those who are most susceptible to severe forms of Covid-19 and identifies the likelihood that someone will experience long Covid," said Ariel Jaitovich, MD, associate professor of medicine and of molecular and cellular physiology at Albany Medical College, who is leading the study.
