2. Adoption of November 1, 2023, Minutes

The minutes were reviewed, a motion was made to accept them, and it was approved.

3. Review of 2024-25 New York State Budget

- 8 MSSNY's 2024-25 budget proposal was reviewed by Mr. Auster who highlighted
- 9 these key areas:
- 10 A) Telehealth
- Mr. Auster indicated that Governor Hochul is proposing to extend the telehealth
- insurance payment parity law for an additional year. He stated that Ms. Cary has
- been working with other specialty societies to ensure that it surpasses this one-
- 14 year period.
 - B) Patient Centered Medical Home
- Mr. Auster indicated that there has been high funding for the Patient Centered
- 18 Medical Home Program. This is particularly important for primary care physicians.
- 19 The program was removed a few years ago, however the state is now looking to
- 20 increase the per member per month bonus payments that pediatricians and PCPs
- 21 receive for managing Medicaid care for both adult and pediatric patients.

6 7 23 C) CPH Issue

Mr. Auster indicated that in terms of repealing authorization for the MSSNY's Committee for Physicians Health (CPH) program, there has not been a rational explanation for this decision. He stated that last year, the governor acknowledged that the authorization for the program was approaching and proposed to extend it for an additional 10 years. However, not much progress has been made. Mr. Auster indicated that through his meetings with most legislators, he has been pleased to recognize that they do share the same sentiments regarding confusion on why the CPH program authorization has been repealed. There are letters on MSSNY's GAC website to send to legislators, as well as tweet broadcasts by MSSNY to increase awareness around the issue.

Mr. Auster stated that the Assembly and Senate are finalizing their House Budget Bills, therefore it is important to keep advocating for these issues so that they can be considered and hopefully added to the overall New York State budget.

4. 2024 House of Delegates: resolutions that committee members want to go forward to HOD.

A) CPH Resolution that ID Committee is sponsoring - Dr. Valenti Dr. Valenti indicated that this resolution has been reviewed and endorsed by other public health committees and is now looking for endorsement from the Quality Improvement and Patient Safety committee, as it helps solidify MSSNY's approach towards public health emergencies. Dr. Valenti reviewed the resolution, which was followed by a discussion by the committee. A motion was made for the committee

to approve the co-sponsorship of the resolution, and it was approved.

B) Resolution to Update Ambulance Call Reports (ACRs') - Dr. Melniker Dr. Melniker indicated that he and his team in the emergency department at NYP Brooklyn Methodist Hospital have been researching the issue of ACRs being too vague for smaller accidents such as scooter accidents and falls in the home. He has spoken to Senator Gounardes on a few occasions about his roadway and cycling safety legislative initiatives, most of which have passed and are a great step forward in terms of this issue. Dr. Melniker indicated that this resolution would call for MSSNY to work with policy makers and funding entities including the American Medical Association and House of Delegates, to provide funding to enhance and update the ARC electronic form, so that it can reflect more granular information on smaller accidents. This would allow improvement in patient care. Ms. Clancy suggested to Dr. Melniker that he submit this resolution by the week prior to the February 28th house deadline.

5. ABMS Portfolio

Dr. Bradley indicated that there is a meeting scheduled with Dr. Hardin, Dr. Gagliano and Ms. Clancy to discuss how to move forward in terms of possible funding sources, as well as program content.

6. Adjournment: A motion was made to adjourn the meeting and it was approved. **Next Meeting Date:** May 8, 2024.
